Seattle Children's Hospital:

Volunteers have been at the heart of Seattle Children's. Since their founding, volunteers have guided the hospital's development, raised funds to keep the hospital's doors open, sewn clothing for the patients to wear, played therapeutic games with the children, and advocated on behalf of the hospital and the health care needs of children in the Northwest.

Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age to volunteer at the hospital in a non-patient area, 18 years of age to have patient contact in the playrooms or pool, 18-21 years of age for other patient areas.

For volunteers 16-17 years of age, a minimum time commitment is 60 hours (weekly, three hour shift, same day and time each week for approx. 5 months). For volunteers 18 or older, a minimum time commitment is 100 hours (weekly, three hour shift, same day and time each week for approx. 9 months).
