Cleveland 8th to 9th Grade Transition Program

Project 206 is a four week summer program for incoming Cleveland Freshman. Students will participate in classes that support them as they transition between middle school and high school, preparing them with the academic skills and social skills needed for a successful 9th-grade year. Students participate in service learning activities throughout the summer and upon completion of the program, students will earn .5 elective credits & 20 service hours.

Selection Criteria: Participants will be selected to attend based on their applications, academic profiles, the input of school & program staff, and commitment. Project 206 funding requires that the majority of students served perform below grade level in reading, or math based on MSP or MAP data and 8th-grade core class grades **OR** attended Cleveland's main feeder middle schools. Students who do not match the criteria will be considered based on teacher, counselor, or administrator recommendations as to what they would gain from their participation in Project 206. We do not have the capacity to provide services for students who are in more than 3 Special Education or English Language Learning (ELL) classes in a day.
